MATTHEW BEERMAN (he/him)


Steam

His short play "The Swallows" was selected for the Smith & Kraus Best Ten-Minute Plays of 2022 anthology and for the William Inge Festival's 2019 New Play Lab. It's been produced across the country. His short play "Debating" was a 2021 semi-finalist for the Lanford Wilson New American Play Festival. A reading of his full-length play "Hyenas" was presented by the Dramatists Guild's Kansas/Missouri Region's Footlights series in 2021. In 2022, Kansas City Public Theatre produced a developmental reading of "Boxed," a gay #metoo play.




